

Salesian Missionary Volunteering



SMV is a service of solidarity, made without cost and freely-given by a young person, sent and welcomed by a community, which is part of the educative and pastoral project of a Salesian presence or promoted by it, with a sufficient continuity of time, motivated by faith, with a missionary style and according to the pedagogy and spirituality of Don Bosco.

(Volunteering in the Salesian Mission Identity and Orientation of Salesian Missionary Volunteering, Rome, 2019)

SMV is a joint initiative of Missions Sector an Youth Ministry Sector of the Salesian Congregation.

In 2019, the updated manual "Volunteering in the Salesian Mission" was published, as the fruit of the contributions and experiences of all the regions of the Congregation, wherein meetings between Youth Ministry and Missionary Animation reflected upon the current situation, perspectives and identity of volunteers in the various provincial realities. Contributors were Salesians and lay experts from the many Provinces committed to volunteering.

Salesian Missionary Volunteering

Salesian: guided by the Preventive System, with an Oratorian heart and family spirit; the service is linked to a Salesian religious community and embedded in an educational and pastoral community, with an educational and pastoral project.

Missionary: expression of the joy of evangelising; the fundamental motivations spring from faith. Volunteers participate in evangelisation through his/her testimony and professional intervention.

Volunteering: done freely, for solidarity and free of charge, with continuity (sufficient dedication of time and perpetuity of the project carried out in an institutionally organised way).



Salesian Missionary Volunteering

The SMV proposes the values of the Gospel with the witness of selfless service and solidarity in education and in the sociopolitical commitment that reaches the realities of family, work and culture.

The integral formation of the volunteers as disciples and missionaries is taken before, during and after the SMV experience, as well the accompaniment.

The accompaniment is offered as educational environment, at group level and at personal level.

A Salesian Missionary Volunteer is sent from a community to another community, according to the provincial organization of SMV.



Participants receive their missionary mandate during the Salesian Mission Day.

Last summer (2024), three camps were organized in Tunisia, Senegal, and Palermo, involving 30 volunteers. For the 2024/2025 year, 80 individuals are enrolled in the Scuola di Mondialità.

In 1986, Fr. Humberto Meneses sent Salesians to assess needs in Tijuana, leading to the creation of 'peripheral oratories' that involved young volunteers working alongside Salesians to foster community leadership. The program has since expanded, serving as a key element of Salesian Pastoral Care. In 2020, the program was updated, aligning with the congregation's 2019 manual.

A road map was drawn up with 9 steps to follow for its construction, which included, from learning about projects in other Provinces, to the design of instruments to carry out a diagnosis. In 1994, a summer camp for Russian youth was organized, continuing annually with varying participation based on fundraising.

Since 1995, volunteer missions have expanded to Ukraine, with short-term missions during holidays. Mission renewals initially took place in Bratislava and Košice, later in Žilina. By 2000, 2,000 volunteers had participated, and each year, around 10 young people undergo training, now serving in countries like those in Africa.

The Salesian Missionary Volunteer (SMV) Program began in the 1990s under Fr. Roger Luna, encouraging young people to serve in the Province and in Tijuana, Mexico. In 2007, JC Montenegro proposed formalizing the program, leading to the approval of the Volunteer Manual in 2009. Since then, about 57 volunteers have been placed globally, with a focus on transformative service and personal growth.

Collaborating with the Salesian Lay Missionaries in New Rochelle, the SMV Program fosters compassion, solidarity, and cultural immersion, impacting both volunteers and communities. Volunteers describe the experience as life-changing, embodying Salesian values of service and global fraternity.


VOLUNTARIADO MISIONERO SALESIANO UY


HEART IN HAND

The program received official recognition and approval in 2019. By 2024, approximately 150 volunteers had been sent on eight expeditions to five mission regions, both domestic and abroad.

New volunteers undergo four months of formation from February to May each year, prior to being sent on missions that commence in June and last for one or two months. Services extending beyond two months are considered only after this initial short experience.

The most emphasized phase of this pastoral program is the post-mission formation.

With approximately 40 volunteers who have been committed to the postmission programs for at least three continuous years, the next step of the program is to establish an office, managed by the youth, specializing in educational development projects.
